



THE BISHOPS CORNER



What does the Bible say about Perseverance?

The Bible has a lot to say about perseverance in several different contexts. Clearly, the Scriptures teach that those who "overcome" and persevere in the faith will inherit eternal life (Revelation 2:7). This truth is also expressed in Colossians 1:23 where we see that people will be holy, blameless, and above reproach "if they continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel." So all Christians should be in agreement that those who are ultimately saved are those who do persevere and continue to believe the gospel.

There are two very distinct views on the issue of perseverance of the saints among Christians. The first is the Arminian view that it is possible for true Christians to turn away from God and not persevere. This is consistent with the concept of salvation which has man's "free will" at the center of it. It is logically consistent that, if man's "free will" choice is the

determining factor of his salvation, then it would also be possible for that man to later choose to reject God and thereby lose his salvation.

However, the Bible clearly teaches that we are "born again" by the Holy Spirit, which results in our coming to faith in Christ. All who have been "born again" do have eternal security and will persevere. The doctrine of the perseverance of the saints is founded in the promise that "he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6) and Jesus' declaration that "all that the Father gives me will come to me" and "I shall lose none of them that he has given me" (John 6:37, 39).

Beyond the concept of perseverance in regard to salvation, there are biblical exhortations to persevere in the Christian life. In his pastoral epistles to Timothy, the apostle Paul reminds the young pastor to "watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers" (1 Timothy 4:16). Timothy's character was that of a godly man, and his doctrine was sound and scriptural. Paul warned him to

watch them both closely and persevere in them because—and this is a warning to all Christians—perseverance in godly living and believing the truth always accompany genuine conversion (John 8:31; Romans 2:7).

Further exhortations to persevere in the Christian life come from James, who warns us to be "doers of the word and not hearers only" because those who hear but do not do are "deceiving themselves." "But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it [perseveres]...this one will be blessed in what he does" (James 1:22-24). The sense here is that the Christian who perseveres in godliness and the spiritual disciplines will be blessed in the very act of persevering. The more we persevere in the Christian life, the more God grants His blessings upon us, thereby enabling us to continue to persevere. The psalmist reminds us that there is great reward in persevering in the Christian life. In keeping God's commandments, there is "great reward" for our souls (Psalm 19:11), peace of mind, a clear conscience, and a witness to the world more eloquent than many words.

James also exhorts us to persevere "under trials" because those who do will be blessed and will receive the "crown of life" which God has promised (James 1:12). Just as the true believer will be eternally secure in his salvation, his faith will also persevere in affliction, sickness, persecution, and the other trials of life that befall all believers. If we desire to live godly lives in Christ, we *will*suffer persecution (2 Timothy 3:12), but the faithful will persevere, kept by the power of the Holy Spirit who is the guarantee of our salvation and who will keep us "strong to the end," persevering so we will be "blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 1:8).

Overcoming Fear When Sharing Your Faith

The fear we feel when it comes to sharing our faith is very real, even though it's irrational. If we were going to be burned at the stake for being a Christian, or thrown to hungry lions, then our fear would make sense. But it's nevertheless very real and it can paralyze us if we listen to it. So how can we just ignore it? Imagine you see a four-year-old child fall into an icy swimming pool. I'm sure that you would ignore any thought of the cold water and immediately dive in because you are thinking of something infinitely more important than your comfort: the life of a human being. That's the mentality you and I must have with evangelism. We need to forget about how our flesh feels and instead think about what awaits people if they die in their sins.

Here is something else to think about. How would you and I describe the character of a person who could stand at the edge of the pool and let the child drown because the water was too cold? Then we need to apply that name to ourselves, if we let fear hinder us from speaking to the lost. Do you remember how Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist, was struck dumb because he didn't believe God's promise? The angel said to him, "But behold, you will be mute and not able to speak until the day these things take place, because you did not believe my words which will be fulfilled in their own time" (Luke 1:20).

Perhaps you and I can identify with Zacharias. It's our lack of faith in God that causes us to be struck dumb when it comes to sharing our faith. If we fully trusted God, we wouldn't hesitate to open our mouths. If we find ourselves in that position, we should do what Zacharias did when he wanted to say something. He called for a "writing tablet" and used the written word. If you and I are too timid to witness or preach, then we should use the written word by giving out gospel tracts. It's better to do that than do nothing. But then let that give you the confidence to speak to one person, then perhaps to a few gathered around you... and eventually to a crowd in an open-air setting.

Experts tell us that most deaths from skydiving happen because of "human error," insinuating that careful skydivers will be okay. In reality, one jumper in every 100,000 fall to their deaths. Instead, if you are bored with life and want an adrenaline rush, try open-air preaching. It's more dangerous than skydiving (see Acts 7:57–60), arguably more scary, and infinitely more productive. And if your life is taken from you while you are preaching, at least your death will not be from human error. Rather, it will be by divine permission.

I have a friend who works for the US Customs Department. He's about 6'3", has a deep voice, and looks like how you'd imagine a federal agent to look. He flies jets that chase drug runners. Tough guy. Yet he said, "I have been skydiving, scuba diving, and drag racing, have ridden motorcycles and flown jets and helicopters, but by far the scariest thing I ever did was to get up on a soapbox and preach the gospel. But as soon as I stepped off that box I couldn't wait to get up and preach again." I know exactly what he meant.


The second day I preached in Christchurch I was more nervous than the first. This is probably because after preaching once I had eased my restless conscience. I could then say to that nagging voice, "I did it, now back off." So the second time I didn't have the provocation of my conscience; it was simply a matter of my will. Would I preach because I cared about people,

or was it all about getting rid of guilt? Day after day I had that same feeling that had me visiting the restroom multiple times each morning before I rode my bike the mile or so from my leather shop to The Square. This went on for about three months. Finally, after preaching that many times I was still nervous, but it became more under control.

However, even after thousands of times, it remains a matter of discipline. It is a matter of setting my face like flint and ignoring negative thoughts, fears, tiredness, and other things that want to take priority. When I get texts today asking if I will be preaching open-air at Huntington Beach, I usually reply, "Is the pope a sinner?" Of course I will be open-air preaching, God willing—and I know He is.

We are soldiers in the most real of wars. No soldier fights on his own whims. I dare to say that few want to enter the heat of battle, but they go because they are not their own. They go because they've been instructed to go. That's the essence of soldiering. So as you enter the battlefield, keep in mind that courage isn't the absence of fear, but the conquering of it. If we really care for the lost, each of us must learn to push aside the fear of man and replace it with a healthy fear of God. How could we not obey Almighty God when He has commanded us to speak to the lost?

Some decisions seem to direct the course of our lives more than others. As believers, we desire to choose the right path—God's path—with every decision we make.

If you're facing some choices today, and you aren't sure which road is the right one to take, here are 10 scriptures for when you need to make a decision that will give you confidence that God will speak to you. If you're tuned in to Him, you will make the right decision. (All scriptures are taken from the *NIV*.)

1. "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11)

2. "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you." (Psalm 32:8)

3. "Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." (Psalm 119:105)

4. "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

5. "For lack of guidance a nation falls, but victory is won through many advisers." (Proverbs 11:14)

6. "Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisers they succeed." (Proverbs 15:22)

7. "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the LORD establishes their steps." (Proverbs 16:9)

8. "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Matthew 7:7-8)

9. "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28)

10. "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you." (James 1:5)

God wants to give you guidance! He desires that you walk with Him to get the light you need for each step you take in life. He is not the author of confusion. Step forward in confidence with Him!
